- A person who has a natural passion for protecting civil rights
- A person who has a willingness to learn about emergency management and disability history
- A person who has a sincere commitment to work independently
- A person who has a strong written and verbal communication skills
- A person who has strong computer skills on platforms including Facebook, Twitter, and YouTube
- A person who is a resident of Arizona
- A person who has reliable internet and computer access
- A person who is currently enrolled in an accredited community college or university
- A person who is able to dedicate 10-15 hours per week (*with flexibility to accommodate class schedules/other commitments*)

This position will report to the Disability Integration Specialist and will contribute to promoting individual emergency preparedness with an independent living philosophy. Examples of duties include preparing marketing materials for upcoming conference on emergency preparedness, coordinating an individual preparedness education campaign across several social media channels, and creating social media posts about current events related to emergencies, especially news about the ongoing COVID-19 crisis.
